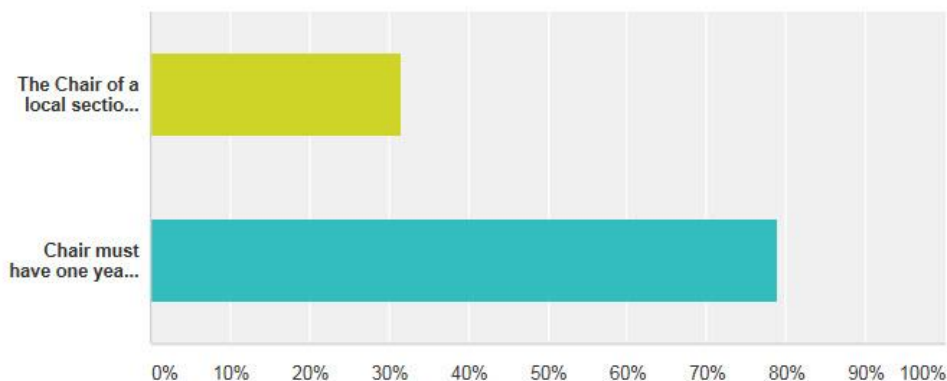

▼ The Chair of a local section must have, at a minimum, an undergraduate degree or be a member of YM/G (unless they are >35 years old). (Note this means that a senior student can run as Vice Chair/Chair elect; attain an undergraduate degree and take over as the Chair on the follow on term).

▼ Chair must have one year of experience on the Executive Committee for Local Section. Serving as the Vice Chair/Chair Elect meets this requirement. (Note this satisfies the leadership, mentoring, succession, and local section process experience).

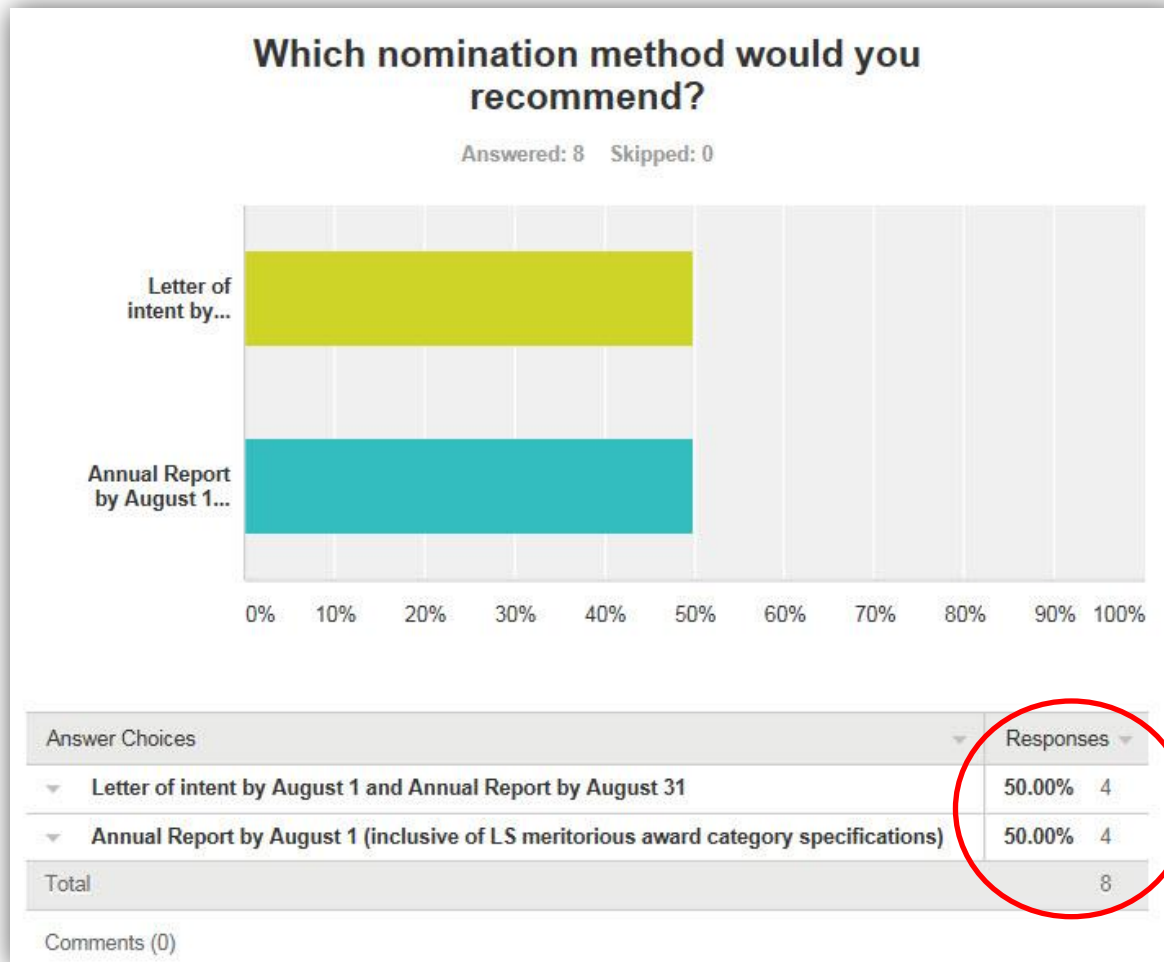

Things to know about Twitter

1. Shorten links before posting – otherwise they take too much of your 140 character count.
2. Photos take up a portion of your character count, so use a photo that is worth it.
3. In July 2015 Twitter changed direct messages. You can now write more than 140 characters.

Things to know about Twitter

4. Tweets with images get the most attention.
5. Try to use no more than two (2) hashtags (#) in a post.
6. Put a period before @ at the start of the tweet if tweeting to someone so it appears globally.
. @ans_org will be seen by your followers, just @ans_org will only be seen by ANS.
