SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The American Nuclear Society is pleased to present our annual Scholarship Program. Recipients will be awarded \$1,000 - \$5,000 based on merit and financial need.

Who is eligible?

Undergraduate and graduate scholarships are open to ANS student members enrolled in a course of study relating to a degree in nuclear science or nuclear engineering.

U.S. and non-U.S. residents may apply if they are enrolled or planning to enroll in an accredited institution in the United States (or its territories). ANS members from established international student sections may also apply.

Incoming freshmen scholarships are open to graduating high-school seniors who have enrolled, full-time, in college courses and are pursuing a degree in nuclear engineering or have the intent to pursue a degree in nuclear engineering.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Undergraduate and Graduate applicants must secure two faculty or employer references, submit current school transcripts, and write a 500-word essay. Additional essays or questions may be required for local section and division-administered scholarships.
