Southern California Edison closes San Onofre. Maximizing the Assets: A status report on license renewal and power uprates. MidAmerican Energy Company defers consideration of small modular reactors. NRC order on Mark I and II containment vents revised. Focus on Finance. Three more amendments to Vogtle COL approved, another ITAAC closed. NRC finds flood susceptibility at Sequoyah and Watts Bar. NRC revises white finding at Summer to green. NRC invites comments on review standard for mPower small modular reactor. Final environmental impact statement issued for Watts Bar-2. License renewal applications filed for Braidwood and Byron. Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards issues report on key licensing issues for the Next Generation Nuclear Plant. Fermi-3 safety review moved back six months; other licensing developments.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

States challenge scope of NRC's review of waste confidence rule. New packaging technique accelerates waste disposal at Idaho site. Diablo Canyon cited for cask loading violation. NRC finds three violations at Hematite facility. DOE's Office of Inspector General says WIPP TRU waste disposal capacity is being underutilized. Last part of K-25 Building at Oak Ridge nears demolition. Aerial survey of West Lake Landfill finds no radiological hazard. ZionSolutions' license transfer approved by NRC.

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INTERNATIONAL

United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation finds no immediate health effects from Fukushima Daiichi accident. Horizon signs contract for Wylfa new-build project. Forged test reports on safety-related cables found at South Korean nuclear plants. Competition to complete Angra-3 in Brazil is reopened. Head of Japan Atomic Energy Agency resigns amid growing safety concerns. IAEA opens emergency response center in Fukushima. Nuclenor reconsiders shutdown of Garoña plant in Spain. Construction of Barakah-2 gets under way in UAE. Vattenfall reactor lifetimes to be extended up to 60 years. Cancer study conducted in vicinity of Ontario plants. China Guangdong Nuclear Power Group changes its name.
