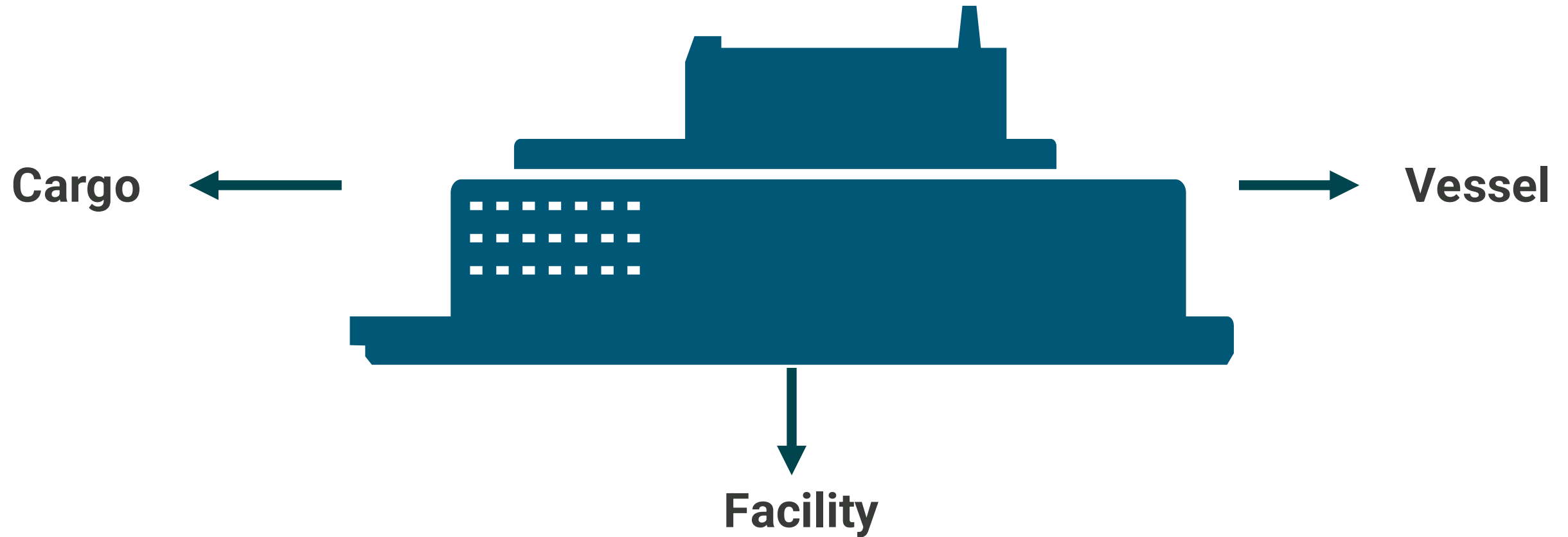

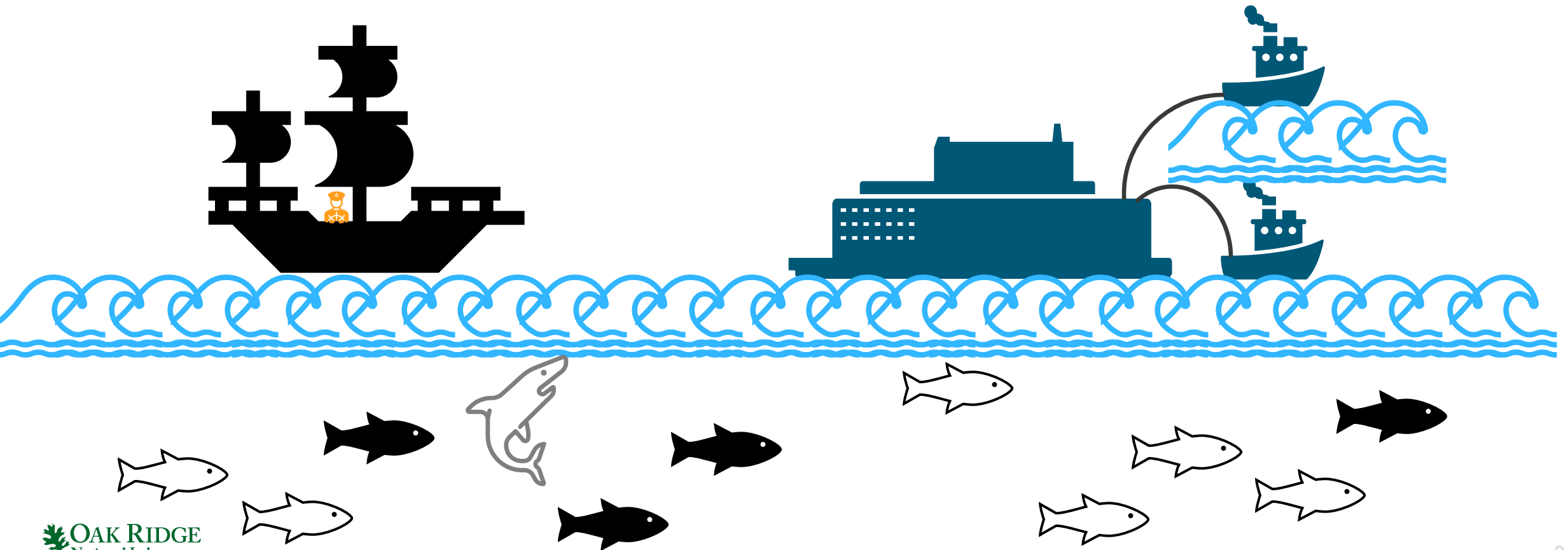

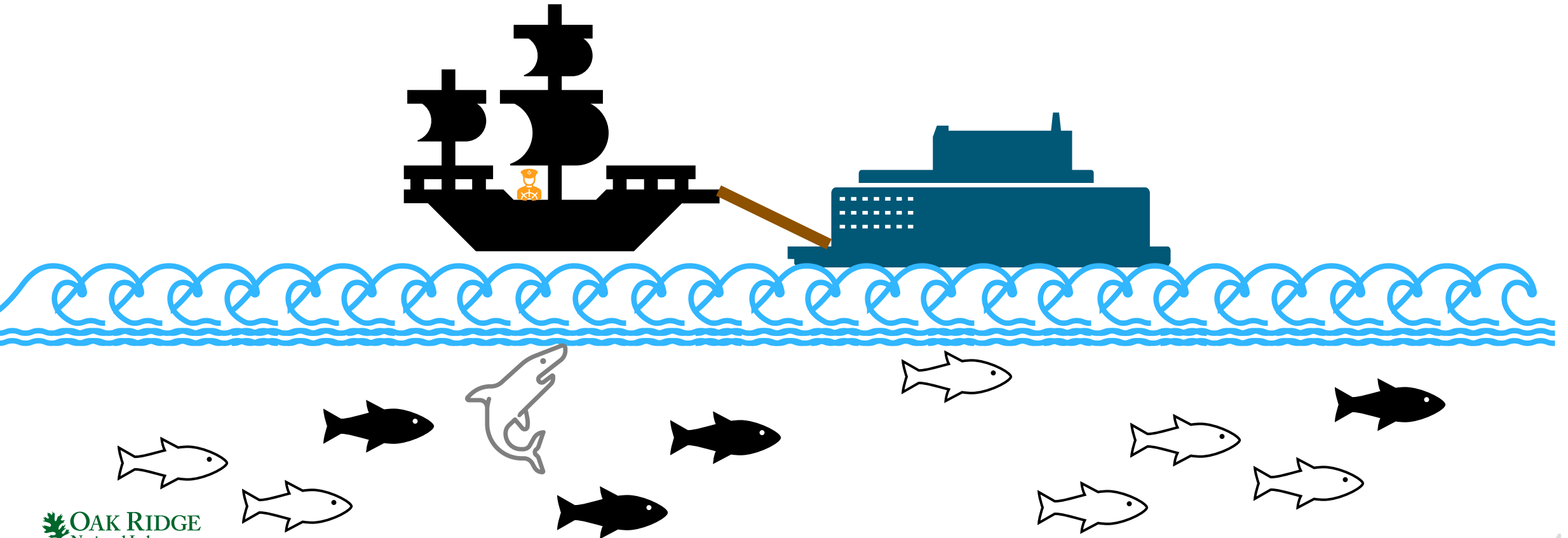
Floating Nuclear Power Plants remain undefined in the international community



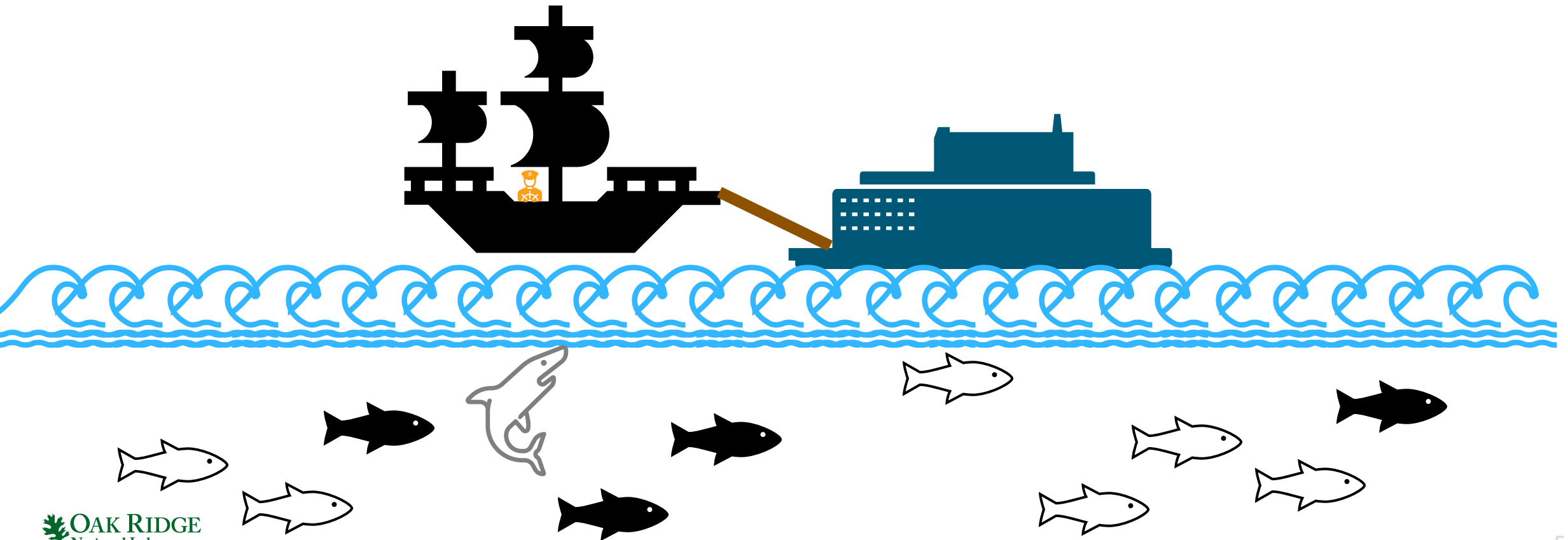
A common concern for FNPPs is the threat of Piracy, and whether FNPPs are susceptible to piracy on the High Seas



When the FNPP is not moving, an FNPP is considered a facility and therefore cannot be susceptible to acts of Piracy



However, in the absence of Law of the Sea, Nuclear Security instruments such as the ACPPNM, ICSANT, and SUA Protocol apply



Deployment of FNPPs on the High Seas introduce novel nonproliferation questions requiring further consideration of efforts such as universalization
